

**Cat Hollow State Forest** is a 759-acre state forest, located in the Town of Sanford in the southeastern corner of Broome County. Its southern boundary runs for approximately three-quarters of a mile directly along the New York-Pennsylvania border. It is named after cougars that once roamed there before 1900. Hunting, birdwatching, and hiking are popular activities. While it lacks formal trails, visitors can explore beaver ponds, streams, and the 1.2-mile abandoned McMurray Road.
