


Moss Island is located between the Mohawk River and New York State Barge Canal in Little Falls. It is composed of an igneous intrusion of syenite, and became an island when canal locks were built so boats could avoid the 40-foot (12 m) falls. It is known for its large 50 foot deep potholes as well as being popular with local rock climbers. It was declared a National Natural Landmark in 1976.
