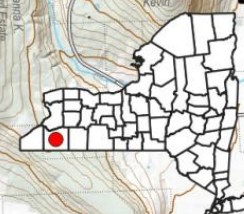

Located in Cattaraugus County, New York, **Rock City State Forest** is a 2,905-acre natural area famous for its massive conglomerate boulders. Naturally arranged like "buildings" and "streets," these house-sized formations offer labyrinthine passages, narrow corridors, and scenic hiking trails perfect for exploring unique geological wonders and diverse hardwood forest. Several designated tent campsites can be found with picnic pavilions at many of the sites.
